A new agreement must be drafted and signed, and then companies will be asked to bid on the project. We are awaiting approval at the federal level. Mayor Goosman is following up on a regular basis. CALL TO ORDER AND QUORUM

Mayor Goosman called the meeting to order at 6:35 pm and acknowledged that a quorum was present.

There were two council vacancies as of January 1, 2024. In January, Miranda Kridler was appointed to fill one vacancy. Tonight, the mayor appointed Jason Bew to fill the other vacancy. He was sworn in at 6:40 pm.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: none

MINUTES - The typed minutes of the January meeting were presented—The motion to approve was made by David Arrington and seconded by Jason Bew (with two changes). SOLICITOR REPORT - N/A

FISCAL OFFICER REPORT - Tabitha was absent due to illness. Unreconciled financials were presented, but no vote was taken.

Safety Report: Chief Miller is training Deputy Jerry Darst to manage the village during his time in Florida (April to July). Chief Miller will still be available via phone and email to assist Deputy Darst. Chief Miller is pursuing a donated, used cruiser from the Franklin County sheriff's office. Our cruiser now carries Narcan for overdose situations. The state reimburses Amesville for the training time required for all officers—money to be received in March.
